



INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

These instructions are provided to help authors prepare **ABSTRACT/FULL PAPER** for submission to **ADTech-SAB2018** conference. All submitted papers will be in a process of peer review and all accepted papers for either oral or poster presentation will be distributed to the participants at the conference on an electronic data storage device (USB flash drive). It is the responsibility of author to follow the instructions restrictively. **TEMPLATE OF ABSTRACT and FULL PAPER** are provided and could be downloaded from www.adtech2018.info.

1. General

Authors are invited to submit their abstract or full paper (optional), which follow the instruction and provided ABSTRACT Template and FULL PAPER Template, respectively. However, ADTech-SAB2018's committees reserve the rights to select only the FULL PAPER for further publication.

Abstracts/ full paper can be submitted either as an “oral” or a “poster” presentation. Please note that abstracts submitted for an “oral” presentation may be accepted for a “poster” presentation.

In the case of full paper submissions, the submitted manuscript should comprise 6 to 8 pages. All selected full papers will be published in the ADTech-SAB 2018 proceedings (electronic file).

After the conference, full papers with the highest quality will be selected via the peer-review process. Authors of these papers will receive an invitation to submit manuscripts for publication in the Journal “Waste and Biomass Valorization”. The acceptance of full paper for conference presentation does not guarantee subsequent acceptance for journal publication, as the final decision lies with the journal’s Editor-in-Chief”. 2. Authors' responsibilities

2.1 All submitted papers must be in good, grammatically correct English. Authors are fully responsible for the correction of language.

2.2 Major corrections cannot be undertaken by ADTech-SAB2018's committees, and no proofs are provided.

2.3 Submitter paper should provide enough information for peer review. The clear statements should contain the objective, methodology, result and discussion.

3. SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACT

3.1. **ABSTRACT/FULL PAER SUBMISSION will open on 30 May, 2017.** Submitting authors must acknowledge that at least one author of accepted ABSTRACT has to register with the conference and remit the registration fee. Single registration can cover one oral and/or one poster.

3.2. ABSTRACTS/FULL PAPER should be provided in electronic form and uploaded to our online submission website. The format should be complied with the following basic instructions. To avoid any mistake, the **TEMPLATE OF ABSTRACT** is suggested.

3.3. File formats. The preferred format for electronic versions is Microsoft Word, though we can accept most other word-processing packages in PC or Macintosh formats; however, please do not supply your typescript in TeX or as a PDF.

3.4. File naming: When naming files, it is recommended that you incorporate the name of the first author or the paper's reference numbers into the filename (i.e. Author's name- session-presentation type-reference number; P. Kullavanijata *et al.*-session-oral). Please do not use generic names such as "ADTech paper" or similar easily confused variants.

4. ABSTRACT FORMAT

4.1 Page Size:

The page size **MUST** be set to A4 on "Page Setup" of your Word screen for example. This template places all material in a rectangle of 21 cm x 29.7 cm (8.27"x11.69"), beginning 1.25 cm (0.49") and heading 1.25 cm (0.49") from the top and the footer of the page. The page must be formatted using 2.54 (1.0") margins for top, bottom and right. For left, about 3.81cm or 1.5" is suggested.

4.2 Font type:

Times New Roman

4.3 Text size:

- Major heading likes TITLE of paper is typed bold in 14 pt upper cases (capital letters) and setting aligns left.
- Minor headings like ABSTARCT and KEYWORDS of paper are typed bold in 12 pt upper cases (capital letters) and setting aligns left.
- Author's name(s): Author names in 12 pt should consist of first name and middle name initials followed by the complete last name in upper and lower case, setting aligns left.
- Affiliation(s), author's full postal address (es) and corresponding author e-mail are typed 10 pt upper and lower case, italic and setting 2.54 cm (1") from left margin (total 2" from the edge of page).
- The main body texts are typed in 12 pt with align text to justify setting.

- Insert one-line space (12 pt) between paper title, authors' names, addresses, corresponding, text's body and keyword.

4.4 The acceptable length of ABSTRACT is 300-500 words. However, the maximum should be not exceed 1 page (A4).

4.5 Keyword:

3–6 keywords (in alphabetical order) which will enable a subsequent information retrieval system to locate the paper.

5. NOMENCLATURE AND UNITS

5.1 Please take care that all terminology and notation used will be widely understood. Abbreviations and acronyms should be spelled out in full at their first occurrence in the text.

5.2 SI units are strongly recommended.

6. Reference

6.1 Use surname of author and year of publication: Jones (2002) or (Jones, 2002).

6.2 Insert initials only if there are two different authors with the same surname and same year of publication. Two or more years in parentheses following an author's name are cited in ascending order of year, and two or more references published in the same year by the same author are differentiated by letters a, b, c, etc. For example: Brown (1999, 2002, 2003a, b).

Different references cited together should be in date order, for example: (Smith, 1959; Thomson and Jones, 1992; Green, 1999).

6.3 The abbreviation "et al." should be used in the text when there are more than two co-authors of a cited paper.

6.4 References should be listed alphabetically at the end of the paper. Although "et al." is preferable in the text, the list of references all authors should be given.
